AIRPORT REHAB: Bids were let for the Airport Rehab project. JLT Contracting, LLC \$459,663.45, GCS, LLC \$464,492.70, GCC Enterprises, Inc. \$538,088.91, Fahrner Asphalt Sealers, Inc. \$652,383.06

Motion made by Arensdorf, seconded by Harrel approve JLT Contracting, LLC for the Airport Rehab Project in the amount of \$459,663.45. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

SCKEDD: Motion made by Arensdorf, seconded by McFarland approve the contract with SCKEDD for grant writing services for a CDBG Housing Rehab project in the amount of \$3,000. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

LOCHNER CONTRACT: Motion made by Arensdorf, seconded by Harrel approve the Lochner Contract for the Construction observation services in the amount of \$69,600 for the Airport Rehab Project. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

MOWING CONTRACT: Motion made by Arensdorf, seconded by Harrel approve the Airport Mowing contract with Prairie Wind Aviation in the amount of \$12,500 which will also include around the Koch Building. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

PURCHASE REQUEST: Motion made by Arensdorf, seconded by Wollen approve the purchase of 2-2" valves from Myers Aubrey in the amount of \$5,940. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

CORE COMMUNITY DONATION: Motion made by Arensdorf, seconded by McFarland approve for a donation of \$250 to the Youth Core Ministries program. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

PARKS: Kingman County Health Nurse Mary Schwartz advice is the park equipment need not be in use during the stay at home order.

COVID-19 UPDATE: Kingman County Health Nurse Mary Schwartz gave her update on COVID-19. Kingman County Emergency Management Director Richard Schott gave his update and stated the food bank is in good shape and the porch angels are working well.

INTRODUCTION: Chief Lux introduced Brandon Casares and Connick Roe to the Commission. These are the two new police officer recently hired.

ADMINISTRATION: Operations are normal. Obtained homemade masks for employees. Doing daily conference calls on COVID-19 for updates. The Transportation Bus has been helping White's Foodliner with deliveries. Have asked Department Heads to look at cutting budgets 5% and then maybe 10%. 2021 Budget is right around the corner. No real feel on property tax and sales tax outcome.
