Motion made by Wollen, seconded by McFarland allow the Power Plant Mechanic to work with the Ohio Crew on Engine #6. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

Motion made by Arensdorf, seconded by Wollen extend Emergency Payment Plan and Small Business Application deadline to June 8. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

SWIMMING POOL: Brandon thinks he has things worked out and is planning to open the pool on June 19th.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT: The Chamber will be getting new banner hangers for downtown. Us 54 CLIPP is resurfacing from Dollar General to east city limits. Working with bond council for refinancing bonds. Sales Tax is still strong. City Crews and staff have dealt with a lot through this pandemic. Thank them when you see them.
