MINUTES: Motion made by McFarland, seconded by Hacker, approve the minutes of the March 24, 2022, meeting. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

BILLS PAYABLE: Motion made by McFarland, seconded by Hacker, approve the bills payable in the amount of \$753,432.81. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

FAÇADE APPLICATION: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by McFarland approve the façade application from Joe Harbert, Leslie Schrag and Dave Harbert at 121 West A Avenue. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

Resolution #2022-5

Motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wollen adopt the resolution authorizing the offering for sale of General Obligation Bonds, Series 2022-B, of the City of Kingman, Kansas. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

MASTER AGREEMENT: Michael Kramer with Wilson & Company present a Master Agreement update to the Commission. Motion made by Wollen, seconded by McFarland approve the Master Agreement with Wilson & Company. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

BOUNCE HOUSE SIGNATURE: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by McFarland allow Josh Beck to sign the Big Sky Party Rentals, LLC agreement behalf of the City. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

MIZE & CO LEASE: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by McFarland approve the Mize & Co. Lease to extend 20 years. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

Mayor Harrel arrived via ZOOM.

SELL FIREWORKS FROM TRAILER: Jeremy Hopkins would like to sell fireworks from a mobile trailer in the city or to set up in a park. His third idea was to order from his website and deliver to customer. The City does not allow fireworks to be sold on public property. He needs to have some sort of insurance and needs to contact the State Fire Marshall about a mobile unit.

Motion made by Hacker, seconded by McFarland table the discussion until more information can be obtained. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

PUBLIC FIREWORKS PERMIT: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wollen approve for Kapow Fireworks to shoot the fireworks for public display in Riverside Park on July 4th at dark with a rain date of July 5th. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

CMB: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wollen approve the Cereal Malt Beverage License for Jeri's Kitchen at 312 N Main. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

US 54 BY-PASS: Motion made by McFarland, seconded by Hacker sign the letter to KDOT in support of US 54 By-pass. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

DISPATCH CONTRACT: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wollen address that the Commission would like to have a written report of expenditures and receipts quarterly from Dispatch before signing the contract. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

ARPA: Motion made by Wollen, seconded by McFarland fill the paperwork out for ARPA Monies to address Revenue Loss Replacement. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: At 8:07 p.m. motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wollen recess into executive session with the City Manager, City Attorney, and the Kingman Fire Chief to discuss matters related to the acquisition of real property pursuant the preliminary discussion of the acquisition of real property exception in K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(6). The open meeting will resume in the city commission chambers in 7 minutes. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

The regular meeting reconvened.

Motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wollen proceed with the real estate contract with Wade Boor pending verification of taxes. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT: Clean up week is April 24 to April 30. Lifeguards are needed at the pool. Met with FEMA today and will again on Monday. We have a Jr. Fireman moving over to the regular crew. Attorney Smith sent letters to the heirs of the Sheahan property that he could find. Received a phone call from Dennis Sheahan. There is an appointment with Matt Ricke. Going to meet with the School District about getting the Jr. Fire Fighters in the school program. Looking into ordering polo shirts for office staff and Commission if they want one.

COMMISSION COMMENTS: Trees are down in Depot Park. Would we have any use for the vacant lot west of the proposed Fire Station. Sidewalk work is being done.
