Kingman, Kansas August 25, 2022

AGENDA: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wallace approve the agenda. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

MINUTES: Motion made by Wollen, seconded by Hacker approve the minutes of the August 11, 2022, meeting. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

BILLS PAYABLE: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by McFarland approve bills payable in the amount of \$1,040,152.88. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

MUSEUM: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by McFarland close C Avenue from Main Street to Spruce Street for a car show on September 24, 2022, from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

Motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wallace allow the Historical Society to host a Cemetery Tour on October 15, 2022, at the Cemetery at 4:00 p.m. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

PROMOTIONS & RECOGNITIONS: Don Ziegler has been promoted to Lieutenant for EMS Rescue and Maddie Rhodes to Captain for Kingman EMS

EMS CONTRACT: Discussion was held on the 2023 EMS Contract.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Tad Hacker presented a proclamation to the Commission to adopt for Constitution Week.

Motion made by McFarland, seconded by Wallace adopt the Constitution Proclamation for the week of September 17 to 23, 2022. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: Julie Lyon with Carthouse investments purchased 1101 East Highway 54 and would like to take part in the Economic Incentive Program.

Motion made by McFarland, seconded by Wollen approve the contract with Julie Lyon and Carthouse Investments for the Economic Incentive program for rehabilitation, repair, and restoration of 1101 East Highway 54 up to \$8,000. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

Motion made by Hacker, seconded by McFarland proceed with the MIH Grant with Crain & Co. as the developer of the 14 lots in Memory Lane Addition. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.
