AGENDA: Motion made by Wollen, seconded by McFarland approve the agenda. Motion declared carried.

MINUTES: Motion made by Wollen, seconded by Wallace approve the March 9, 2023, minutes. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

BILLS PAYABLE: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wallace approve the bills payable in the amount of \$561,502.42. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Shasta Weve from Polished Coupe is having a 5-year anniversary party on May 11, 2023. She would like to close Sherman Street from Main to Spruce. She would like to have the splash pad in the park going and the bathrooms open. She plans to have food trucks, bouncy house and John Conlee. Hank from FM 99.7 radio station will also be broadcasting. She will need to work the details out with Manager Graffman and Chief Lux.

LIBRARY BOARD: Motion made by McFarland, seconded by Wallace appoint Linda Langley to the Library Board for a one-year term. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

Motion made by McFarland, seconded by Hacker allow alternative funding with Payer Matrix for specialty drugs. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

WSU PPMC CONTRACT: Motion made by Wollen, seconded by Hacker allow WSU to do a Fire Department Assessment through Cranfield Jenkins & Associates in the amount of \$27,500.00. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

FAA RUNWAY & TAXI LANE REPAIRS: Bids were as follows: Base Bid + Alt 1 + Alt 2: American Pavement Solutions, Inc. \$283,897.26; National Sealant & Concrete, LLC \$311,681.30; Scodeller Construction, Inc. \$346,594.84; Screed Tech, LLC \$366,561.25; Fahrner Asphalt Sealers, LLC \$422,736.34; Interstate Sealant & Concrete, Inc. \$441,394.84; Snodgrass & Sons Construction Co. \$485,414.25; GDS, LLC \$673,266.25; Engineer Estimate was \$548,668.75.

Motion made by Wollen, seconded by Wallace award the bid to American Pavement Solutions, Inc. in the amount of \$283,897.26. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

AIRPORT MOWING: Motion made by McFarland, seconded by Hacker award the bid to Sowers Handyman Service LLC in the amount of \$2,745.00 a month from April to October. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

FLOCK CAMERAS: Two cameras will be placed in the city limit of Kingman, one at each end of 54 Highway. Diversion money will pay the first year, with the Police department paying the \$700 for set-up fee.

Motion made by McFarland, seconded by Wallace approve the Flock Cameras for the City Of Kingman for a \$700 set-up fee.

2023 RESIDENTIAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by McFarland approve the 2023 Residential Improvement Program. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

RECESS: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by Wallace recess the meeting to call the Land Bank meeting to order. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

The Land Bank meeting adjourned and the regular meeting reconvened.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS REBATE: Motion made by Hacker, seconded by McFarland table the Special Assessment Rebate Application until more information is obtained. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.

ADMINISTRATION: The Utility Bill Template will be at the next meeting. KDOT is allowing the City to move forward with the truck parking lot on South Main Street. We are awaiting the permit. The CCLIP Project will be from the West City Limits to the Hospital Drive. FEMA obligated \$49,000 in administrative fees to the project. There is a Facility Planning seminar for Fire Stations in April that Manager Graffman would like to attend. There is talk about an 80' x 80' airport hanger being built. The sound system will be installed next week.

COMMISSION COMMENTS: About \$120,000 was earned in interest this year from CD's. Commissioner McFarland received an ad for flashing speed limit signs. In Rotary Park, there is growth in the riverbed that needs attention. Applying for a CDBG grant for Walker Park. Is there a replacement program for the trees that are being taken down in Riverside Park? Has there been any movement on the Bypass?

There being no further business upon motion of Hacker, seconded by Wallace meeting adjourned at 9:29 p.m. Motion declared carried by unanimous vote.
